

Mission statement

Our Charity is the **Bright Horizons Foundation for Children**. Our focus is to **improve the quality of life for children in our local communities** who are impacted by crisis and experiencing disadvantage. We work with community agencies to create **Bright Spaces** to provide children and families undergoing crisis and living in temporary accommodation – such as domestic violence shelters or refugee centres - with a place to play, learn, and have fun and most of all feel safe. These **safe, welcoming and enriching play environments** can provide comfort for children and families in their time of need and also help to ensure that the children experience the vital opportunities for play, learning and discovery which will equip them for best life chances in the future.



We believe...

- That every child has the right to a **happy childhood**.
- That every individual has the power to **change lives** and **make a difference**.
- That our **greatest assets** are the talents of our employees **working together** with our children, their families, our partners, clients and suppliers to make a difference to the lives of families in need.



Why Bright Spaces are needed

One million children in the UK are affected by repeat homelessness; one in 10 children lives in overcrowded households and has no access to safe play.

- **1.6 million** children in Britain live in housing that is over-crowded, temporary, or run-down. Some live in housing that's making them ill. (Shelter)
- **750,000** children are affected by domestic violence in the UK. Many of them will be at direct risk of physical violence, as well as the emotional damage that exposure to domestic violence does. (Women's Aid Annual Survey 3, Women's Aid, 2014)
- **100,000** children in the UK woke up homeless on Christmas day last year (Shelter)

Since 2005 we have established 50 Bright Spaces, with many more under development. Our partners have included Refuge, Women's Aid, Refugee Action, Her Majesty's Prison Service, The Metropolitan Police and local housing charities. Each Bright Space has its own story:

Our partners Refugee Action in Manchester say that our Bright Space in their waiting room brings "a ray of sunshine" to families while they wait to be seen, sometimes for hours on end and often having just arrived in the country. Our teen space in Livingstone Scotland offers sanctuary to young adults faced with an uncertain future: "The teen room in the refuge is a quiet chill out zone. It provides peace and quiet – a place young people can gather their thoughts and relax."

A nine month old baby came to a refuge with his mother fleeing abuse. The baby had witnessed extreme violence and would not be prized away from his mother, he clung to her 24 hours a day and the mother and child stayed within their room. Slowly staff coaxed the woman into the Bright Space family room. The baby continued to be wrapped around his mother but gradually started to show an interest in what the other children were doing. After many months of slow persuasion the baby finally got onto the floor and played with the other children. Without this Bright Space, this may never have happened.

From the Metropolitan police "We have been dealing with a very complex sexual abuse case where a number of children within a family have been victims. They all have differing degrees of learning difficulties. As such we arranged a number of familiarisation visits / rapport building sessions with them all at the Gilbert Suite before their actual interviews. They loved the suite, especially the family room. We were able to interview all three of them, after a number of visits and they all provided evidence that supports our ongoing investigation.

After having such poor facilities for so long, it was great to bring them to such welcoming and bright surroundings...and be able to utilise it to its full potential."

The Bright Horizons Foundation for Children in the UK and Ireland supports over 8,000 children who use our Bright Spaces. These Bright Spaces are only made possible because of the fundraising and passion of our nursery staff and families, our clients, contractors, and suppliers, and our supporters in our local communities. With your support we will continue to grow and reach more children and families: thank you for all that you do.








Making a difference to children and families...

Some of the thank you messages we received from the families at Refuge for the fantastic seasonal boxes and pamper bags:


"Thank you for all the presents for myself and my children. It made me cry because it was nice to see my children so happy and excited when opening the presents. I have not seen them like this for a long time."

"This was the best Christmas we've ever had. My son was so excited and seeing him so happy and opening such great presents made a huge difference on this festive day."


By providing **Bright Spaces** for children in shelters the Bright Horizons Foundation supports children like these to find some normality in a safe and stimulating environment where they can play and learn.
